

Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School

## **2014 ANNUAL REPORT**



The mission of Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School is to provide students with a rich, rigorous arts-infused high school program that enables them to succeed in college and careers.



The mission of Capital Region Arts and Education is to provide educational opportunities for students and adults in the Capital Region of Central Pennsylvania by offering high quality multidisciplinary arts instruction, other educational instruction, professional development and related education activities. As the founding organization of Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School (CASA), CRAE conducts fundraising on behalf of CASA to close the gap between state funding and the budgetary requirements to operate the school.



On August 25, 2013, Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School (CASA Charter School) began its inaugural year as a full-time arts education charter high school. CASA Charter School welcomed 135 full-time accepted students to study one of six disciplines: creative writing, dance, film and video, music, theatre, and visual art. The excitement associated with opening the school gave parents, teachers and our community the opportunity to reflect on our past, where we are today and the promising future that was in front of us for CASA Charter School.

Capital Area School for the Arts (CASA) was founded in 2001 through a partnership between the Capital Area Intermediate Unit and Open Stage of Harrisburg. The school provided a part-time arts education program to students throughout central Pennsylvania. The original goal of the school was to provide a place where high school students could further their arts education by supplementing their high school day in their home school district.

In 2001 nearly all participating school districts provided financial support in the form of tuition for their students to attend CASA; however, by 2012 only three of the twenty-four school districts represented with students attending CASA covered full tuition for their students. As a result of students being unable to afford the tuition and their school districts inability to pay, the number of students attending CASA began to decrease.

With the needs of our talented youth in mind and recognizing the importance of student access to an arts education, in May 2013, Capital Region Arts and Education (CRAE) was formed as a 501(c)(3) to apply to become a full-time Charter School. As of July 16, 2013, the Pennsylvania Department of Education awarded charter school status to Capital Region Arts and Education allowing for Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School (CASA Charter School) to open. In addition to the success in receiving charter school status, CRAE is instrumental in developing the financial resources required to cover the gap of dollars received from the students' home school districts. These funds are used to supplement the academic, cultural and activity programs of CASA Charter School by underwriting experiences that enrich and enhance the lives of the young people in the twenty-eight Pennsylvania school districts represented by students attending CASA Charter School.









No other school in our region is able to offer the same education that CASA Charter School began offering in the 2013-2014 school year. Not only do students master and hone their artistic expertise, they also receive a well-rounded standardsbased education. Only the best teachers with Pennsylvania teaching certificates have been hired in order to ensure that the students are prepared for the future as they continue their education upon graduation.

On June 5, 2014, nineteen students along with their families, teachers and friends celebrated the first graduating class of CASA Charter School. Graduates from our first graduating class have gone on to New York University, Otterbein University, Penn State University, Kutztown University, Harrisburg Area Community College, among many others.

CASA Charter School is a model of innovative and vibrant curriculum that engages students in learning and enhances their creative talents to determine a career path and future role in society. Using the city of Harrisburg and the capital area as a "classroom" for architectural, governmental and community resources, imaginative students can create great art. By inspiring an academic and artistic atmosphere, the region's most talented students will thrive. Graduates will master defined skills that will enable them to be productive, self-directed lifelong learners who appreciate and respect diversity.

CASA Charter School has a bright future. Student enrollment increased to 180 students for the 2014-2015 school year representing twenty-eight different school districts. With the growth in enrollment, CASA Charter School also added additional Mathematics and English teachers. In addition to engaged students, faculty and administration, our parents have formed a parent teacher organization. The partnership between students, parents, faculty, administration and our Board of Trustees is assisting our school in achieving our mission – to provide students with a rich, rigorous arts-infused high school program that enables them to succeed in college and careers.

The end of year performance, recently renamed *CASA Live!*, is an exciting tradition that began with CASA and is continuing at CASA Charter School. The performance is scheduled for May 21, 2015 at Whitaker Center. *CASA Live!* is a one-night, all-original performance that is a shining example of the benefit of a CASA Charter School education.


Work begins on the end of year performance during the first week of school followed by weekly integrated arts sessions. Six art forms collaborate to discover a theme and in the process develop an appreciation for the various disciplines: dance, theatre, music, film and video, visual art, and creative writing. Over the course of nine months, 180 students break into small groups consisting of a mix of these disciplines to discuss and create scenes that later develop into fully-realized components of the performance.

The result? An artistic rendering of a theme more closely related to performance art than a high school musical or narrative play. More importantly, students learn the art of working together – all the highs and lows of collaboration – that culminates in an original, crowd-pleasing performance.

Thanks to community leaders, engaged parents, dedicated teachers and administrators and most importantly talented, passionate students, Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School will be the significant and innovative provider of multidisciplinary arts and academic education to creative students, will attract the most talented and motivated students and be a model for 21st century learning.




