2024-2025 Application for Audition Packet

We appreciate your interest in Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School (CASA). We offer a rigorous, standards-based academic curriculum alongside classes in visual art, dance, music, film and video, theatre, and creative writing for students in grades 9 through 12. We have students from 30 different school districts attending our school. Each student must audition for one of the six different art majors offered for acceptance into the school.

This packet contains all the necessary information a student will need to submit an online application for audition.

AUDITION PROCESS AND CRITERIA

- Review this packet; decide which art major you are interested in applying for (no more than two art majors/auditions).
- Prepare the application based on the information in this packet.
- Complete the online application for audition with necessary attachments.
- Once the application and all required materials are received, you will receive an acknowledgement of receipt and will be contacted to schedule an audition.

IMPORTANT DATES

Application Process – 1st Round

- Complete the ONLINE APPLICATION and attach the required portfolio/material, if appropriate, by January 31, 2024.
- Art teachers will review applications and submitted materials.
 - Applicants will be invited to schedule a live portfolio review and audition at CASA Charter School on February 24, 2024.

Please note that incomplete application packets will be returned and will delay the process.

*Applications received after January 31, 2024, will be held for a possible second round of auditions.

If the applicant does not pass the live group audition, they are not guaranteed individualized feedback but are encouraged to re-apply for the following academic year.

ART MAJORS PRESCREENING & AUDITION INFORMATION

Please read very carefully.

CREATIVE WRITING

Portfolio: The Creative Writing Program requires the submission of a portfolio prior to being invited to a live group audition. Submit the writing portfolio via the online application. Applicants will then be contacted to schedule a live group audition at CASA Charter School on February 24, 2024.

- The Writing Portfolio must include five samples of the student's **original** writing in a variety of styles, such as poetry, short story, memoir, journalism, scripts, etc. All writing samples should be spell-checked and proofread. Samples must be typed in a legible 12-point font. Plagiarism will result in disqualification.

Creative Writing Live Group Audition (Please allow one hour and 30 minutes for audition): During the live group audition, students will complete the following:

- The applicant should bring two original writings to their audition. No other materials will be required.
- Participate in a one-hour creative writing class. The class will be structured as a combination of collaborative and independent work.
- Short written reflection & brief interview concerning the writing created in the live group audition and portfolio.

DANCE

Duration: 2.5 hours

While prior experience is valued, it is not required in order to audition for CASA's Dance Department. We seek students entering 9th, 10th, 11th and 12th grade, who demonstrate a strong passion for the art of dance, a positive attitude, and a willingness to accept discipline and constructive corrections. Students who enjoy being physical on a daily basis and have an interest in studying dance as an art form while collaborating with other art forms this is the place for you. The audition will consist of a dance class involving ballet, jazz, and modern dance technique.

The Audition: The audition consists of three parts, Part 1: dance class involving ballet, jazz and modern dance technique, Part 2: Interview, and Part 3: One and One-half minute (or less) Solo Dance.

*Part 1: Class: Auditionees will take class with the group that consists of basic barre exercises with two or three center exercises, followed by one modern and one contemporary movement phrase. (training, or lack of training, in these techniques does not necessarily determine your outcome of acceptance).

*Part 2: Interview: In order to become familiar with the auditionee, the dance faculty, Ms. Misgalla. will conduct a brief informal interview to see how we can not only provide and meet your needs through the performing arts but academically.

*Part 3: One and One-half minute (or less) Solo dance: All students are required to have (1 ½ minute) solo prepared to show us how they move through their own choreography or their teachers. It is important to choose the dance style that best shows the students ability and talent. We supply the sound system and dongle.

DRESS for Audition: Pick from the following two choices:

1. *Leotard in any style, ballet pink or skin tone convertible tights (to be worn over feet for ballet and rolled up to the ankle for modern), and ballet slippers.*
2. *White form-fitting t-shirt, skin tone or black convertible tights or (to be worn over the feet for ballet and rolled up to the ankle for modern) or black form fitting leggings, and ballet slippers.*

NO Baggy Clothes, NO Jewelry and Hair MUST be pulled back off the face and neck- contained with a hair tie, pins, etc. NO JEWELRY or GUM permitted while auditioning. The attire for the audition is highly suggested but not required. If these items can't be obtained, please wear form fitting clothes.

Items allowed in Dance Studio:

- One head shot any size. Photos do not need to be professionally taken.
- Solo music should be on your phone or CD.
- Water bottle
- Dance bag (street shoes must be carried or taken off before entering the studio).

FILM and VIDEO

The Film and Video Program requires the submission of an original film with the online application in order to be invited to a live film review and audition.

- An original film, three-five minutes in length. Films should be narrative (fictional), and tell a story. Please, no "music videos" unless original music is created. Students must film all original material themselves. Films must include multiple shots and edits. Films should begin with a title screen and end with credits.

Film and Video Audition (Please allow 45 minutes for audition/interview): Students will complete the following:

- A brief interview
- Filming and editing assessments of skill level using school equipment.
- Short film theory questionnaire.

THEATRE

Audition (Please allow 20 minutes for a group warm-up and 30 minutes for the audition): Students will prepare and complete the following:

- Performance of two monologues from published plays; one contemporary (written after 1900) and one classical (written prior to 1900); approximately one minute long each.
- Each participant will receive feedback and have an opportunity to workshop their monologue.
- Please bring a headshot (or recent photo) and acting/theatre resume, if available.
- Ability to articulate the plot of the play and characters from the two monologues.

VISUAL ART

Portfolio: The Visual Art Program requires the submission of a pre-screening portfolio in order to be invited to a live group audition. Submit your visual art portfolio via the online application. Applicants who pass the pre-screening process will be contacted to schedule a live group audition at CASA on February 24, 2024

- Photograph each artwork in even lighting using a smartphone. Please send 6-8 photos of artworks, three of which must be observational drawings. Observational drawings are drawings done from real life people or objects, not photos. Example: Still life drawing, landscape drawing, portrait drawing, etc.
- Title the artworks as such: Your Name, Medium - Example: John Smith, pencil (or pen & ink, pastel, watercolor, acrylic, oil, digital work, etc.)
- *Note: If the applicant does not pass the pre-screening portfolio review, they are not guaranteed individualized feedback but are encouraged to re-apply for the following academic year.*

Visual Art Live Group Audition (Please allow one hour and 30 min for audition): If students pass the pre-screening portfolio review, they will be invited to a live group audition. Students will complete the following:

- Applicant should bring a sketchbook to audition. No other materials will be required.
- Participate in a one-hour drawing class. The class will be structured as a combination of collaborative and independent studio work.
- Short written reflection & brief interview concerning the drawing created in the live group audition and pre-screening portfolio.

MUSIC

Music Portfolio: The Music Program requires the submission of a video portfolio prior to a live audition on February 24, 2024. All videos are to be uploaded to YouTube and submitted via the online application as an unlisted link. The video does not have to be professional quality (a standard HD flip camera will do), but please make sure that the performer's face is clear, and the audio is at an appropriate volume. Inferior video and/or sound quality that makes it difficult to see or hear the performance will not be considered.

All video submissions must contain a continuous, unedited performance of each selection; cuts/edits between movements/selections are acceptable. Videos containing multiple cuts or angles within a single performance will not be considered for the music program.

Audition Requirements

- All applicants must perform two contrasting pieces of music of their choice, one-three minutes in length each, in only **one-performance** area. "Contrasting" means two pieces that sound different from one another either in style (e.g. 1 folk, 1 Broadway or 1 classical, 1 rock/pop) or expression (e.g. 1 fast and technical, 1 slow and expressive).
- Any accompaniment (live or recorded) must be instrumental only.
- At the very beginning of the video, state the following: name (first & last); current grade; the title and composer/songwriter of the 1st piece you will perform and the title and composer/songwriter of the 2nd piece you will perform. Please speak clearly and slowly so that all information can be heard.
- After you complete the video recording, post your video on YouTube in the following manner and send an unlisted link in the online application.

What is an Unlisted Video?

An unlisted video is a different type of private video. "Unlisted" means that only people who know the link to the video can view it (such as friends and family to whom you send the link). An unlisted video will not appear in any of YouTube's public spaces (such as search results, your channel, or the browse page). An unlisted video is different from a private video in these ways: You do not need a YouTube account to watch the video (you can see an unlisted video if someone sends you the video's link). There is no 25-person sharing limit.

YouTube Submission: How to Create an Unlisted Video?

You can choose to make any of the uploads an unlisted video in your YouTube account settings by doing the following:

- Sign into your YouTube account.
- Go to your My Videos page.
- Select the video that you'd like to make an unlisted video. Click the "Edit" button to access the video's settings.
- Go to the privacy section of the page. There you'll see the option to mark your video as "unlisted," "public," or "private." **Select "Unlisted."**
- Don't forget to click the "Save Changes" button. Once you've done this, your video will be an unlisted video.
- Title the video as such: CASA Music Audition: Your Name, Date. Example: **CASA Music Audition: John Smith, 1/2/24**
- Test the link before you send it. You can log out of YouTube and send the link to a second email address you may have or to a family member.
