The mission of Capital Region Arts and Education is to provide educational opportunities for students and adults in the Capital Region of Central Pennsylvania by offering high quality multidisciplinary arts instruction, other educational instruction, professional development and related education activities. As the founding organization of Capital Area School for the Arts Charter School (CASA), CRAE conducts fundraising on behalf of CASA to close the gap between state funding and the budgetary requirements to operate the school.

Capital Area School for the Arts
Charter School (CASA Charter School)
is Central Pennsylvania's premiere
high school for arts education. CASA
Charter School accepts students
based on an audition for entry into
one of six artistic disciplines: creative
writing, dance, film and video, music,
theatre and visual art. Increases in
both applications and enrollment over
the last two years reflect the high



demand for this unique educational opportunity. Since opening in 2013, CASA Charter School has become a hub of creative and academic talent in our region.

In its first two years, CASA Charter School has enjoyed many great successes. Student work has been and continues to be featured in many public venues including local galleries, Midtown Cinema and *TheBurg* monthly magazine. CASA students continue to win awards for their artistic endeavors. In Spring 2015, CASA added a musical to the lineup of annual performances which include a mid-year showcase and an end-of-year performance written and created by the students themselves. The school's first musical *Into the Woods* featured a cast that included students who were accepted into theatre programs at New York University and Atlantic Acting School.

Since its inception, CASA Charter School's faculty, staff and Board of Trustees have prioritized creation and maintenance of a rigorous academic curriculum. Efforts to create an academic program that matches or exceeds those offered by surrounding school districts have proven to be fruitful. For academic year 2014-2015, 11th grade test scores – the only scores counted by the Pennsylvania Department of Education – were among the best in Central Pennsylvania. With a School Performance Profile (SPP) score of 86.0, CASA Charter School ranked in the top tier of schools in the region.

In recognition of its innovative academic programs, CASA Charter School received grants in 2015 to fund the expansion of the biology curriculum from The Foundation for Enhancing Communities via its Whitaker Fund for Math and Science Education and from the Franklin H. and Ruth L. Wells Foundation. These grants allow for increased student engagement, critical thinking skills and overall interest in real-life science problems.

CASA Charter School is home for over 185 students, who are learning, exploring and thriving every day. CASA is truly a place where our students can create themselves.






#### **School Performance Profile (SPP)**

The Pennsylvania Department of Education has published School Performance Profiles for the 2014-2015 school year. **CASA Charter School Building Level Academic Score is 86!** This score places CASA as one of the top-scoring charter schools in the Commonwealth and ranks the school higher than many area public high schools.




#### **Keystone Exam Results**

The 2015 Keystone Exam results validate CASA's investment to transition from online courses to live-taught courses in the 2014-2015 school year.




CASA testers outperformed PA testers on all three tests in 2015.



The pass rate for CASA grade 11 testers improved 19.7% for Algebra, 17.2% for Bio. and 10.0% for Lit. from 2014 to 2015.

#### **Advanced Placement Exam Results**



76% of CASA AP test takers scored a 3 or better on the exam, which qualifies them to receive college credit for those courses. In comparison, only 68% of AP exam testers in the state of PA scored 3 or better. CASA students outperformed the state by 8%.





### revenue & expense comparison

Fiscal Year 2015 actual (unaudited)- Fiscal Year 2016 budget Fiscal Year 2015 (July 1, 2014-June 30, 2015) | Fiscal Year 2016 (July 1, 2015-June 30, 2016)

The graphs below compare actual (unaudited) revenue and expenses for fiscal year 2015 to budgeted revenue and expenses for fiscal year 2016. The 8% increase in expenses needs to be offset by a significant increase in private funds due to school district receipts remaining virtually unchanged (2% increase). The increase in salaries and benefits totals 16%, evidence of CASA Charter School's commitment to maintaining a rigorous academic curriculum.

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
